What does an Enriched Environment look like?

Many random objects are placed on the ground. The dog must be able to sniff them, step on them or even chew them safely.

Then dog is free to explore, without our intervention. There is no requirement to have, each dog, according to his temperament will explore at his own pace. We will select a number of objects appropriate for the individual dog. As an example, for puppies, initially, 2-3 items will be sufficient.



When it comes to your dog, are you looking for :

- mental stimulation?
- an appropriate activity for all dogs?
- a stress-free activity?
- a way to develop curiosity?

How to set up an Enriched Environment?

Spread different type of random objects on the floor. This can include: plastic bottles, old clothes, rags, carpets, toys, umbrellas, cardboard, straw etc.



This can be done outdoors (free in a secure location, or on a long leash), or can also be done indoors. The dog must be able to leave the

area as soon as he wants to stop.



What are the benefits?



- stimulates the 5 senses
- is mentally challenging
- learns to cope with new experiences and with life
- maintains and develops curiosity
- increases brain capacity

Use your friends



Ask them to give you objects they were going to throw out. Everything new is interesting to sniff for the dog.

Do not hesitate to use objects with the scent of other animals.

Anything can become an Enriched Environment.
